There is an artificial biosphere that was built in Arizona in the 1980s, a 3-acre entirely impermeable miniature world, sealed with steel and glass. Supporting Youth Mental Health

JFS fosters youth resilience by providing direct mental health support and training our community partner agencies that work with young people, strengthening their ability to address the challenges that youth face.



JFS increased its capacity for clinical services to better address individual needs, employing a total of seven professionals who work with children and young adults. We offer one-on-one and family therapy for children struggling with anxiety, sadness, loss, trauma, difficult peer relationships, sexuality and gender identity, ADHD, stressed family systems, developmental disability, and autism. We also provide support for parents navigating their child's social-emotional health. We accept all major insurance, including Medicare and Medicaid, and for those who are uninsured or underinsured, we offer services at a sliding scale or free of charge, ensuring that youth can access support without the barrier of cost.

On the community level, we have observed an increased willingness to discuss mental health with peers, parents, and community leaders. Our new Community Mental Health Liaison, a member of our staff, is working to build connections between youth-serving organizations and offers evidence-based trainings to facilitate peer and adult support networks for young people in need. JFS, in partnership with Jewish Federation of Greater Hartford, joined a national network engaging in this work. This initiative, named BeWell, shares best practices and helps JFS support young people right here in Greater Hartford.

This multipronged, collaborative community approach prioritizes children's mental health and helps set the foundation for mentally strong youth today, tomorrow, and well into the future.

BeWELL In partnership with a local school and teen organization, JFS's Community Mental Health Liaison offered a series for seventh graders to foster a healthy school culture and safe space where children feel like they belong and they can talk openly about mental health. This is just one of many offerings, and JFS has more programs planned.



Providing a Path to Financial Wellbeing

Comprehensive Community Supports (CCS) is a new program that pairs community members with a Client Support Specialist to assess their needs, find resources, and connect them with community support for financial wellbeing.

When we first met Tammy*, she hesitated to enroll in CCS. She did not want to take time away from other clients “that needed the assistance more.” After learning about the program’s tools and resources, she opened up about her challenges with debt and budgeting. Taking this first step to confront her financial issues made it possible for Tammy to work with our staff to come up with a plan.

Tammy’s main goal was financial independence, but this goal was hindered by her low salary. We connected her with JFS’s Money Coach and free professional courses available online. This helped her gain skills and confidence, resulting in a \$3,600 yearly raise!

Months into supporting Tammy, she unexpectedly lost a close family member. The Client Support Specialist was there for Tammy, who was grappling with the complications of not only the grief but legal and financial matters related to the estate of her loved one. Tammy and JFS have worked on a budget together, Tammy has been able to clear her debt, and she has started a retirement account. Now, she can make career choices without the burden of debt.

For people who are facing financial difficulties, one unexpected expense can lead to crisis. The reverse is also true, and one positive change can be transformative. This program is designed to be the difference that helps tip the scales towards a positive change.

People like Tammy may be on unstable footing, and need some encouragement, guidance, and moral support. JFS collaborates with CCS participants to help them build a scaffold for growth that secures their financial future.

Anja Rosenberg Kosher Food Pantry

Over the past two years, the Anja Rosenberg Kosher Food Pantry has expanded its reach and broadened its offerings.

In a recently renovated space, we provide a complete grocery shopping experience that features a glass-front refrigerator filled with eggs and baked goods; baskets brimming with apples, oranges, carrots, and onions; shelves packed with cereal, pasta, beans, and challah; and even a pet food and supply section. In a testament to the memory of Gene Rosenberg's boundless generosity, JFS received enough community donations to add additional freezer and refrigerated storage space. This important resource helps ensure that we are always able to have pantry favorites on hand and prevents food from spoiling.

This year, JFS launched The Spice Project, gathering groups of volunteers to package a variety of cooking spices for people who rely on the Anja Rosenberg Kosher Food Pantry. These ingredients have transformative power in the kitchen and are often difficult for families to prioritize on a limited budget. The addition of these spices is just one of the many things that make the Anja Rosenberg Kosher Food Pantry special.



The food pantry is the heart of JFS, a bright, welcoming space that offers an abundance of fresh food, pantry staples, household items, and special holiday meals to make sure that families have all they need to celebrate with their loved ones. The Anja Rosenberg Kosher Food Pantry is a place for families to turn when they are struggling, possible only through the unwavering support of the community volunteers and donors who built a solid foundation that allowed the pantry to grow and flourish. This resource stands as a tribute to the warmth, fortitude, and generosity of our community, seeding a legacy that will help people for generations to come.

Legacy of Hope: Russian-Speaking Holocaust Survivors

Lucy arrived in the US on October 28, 1982, after a 34-day journey from Odessa. She and her family were persecuted in the Soviet Union for being Jewish, experiencing job loss and three years as “refuseniks” before emigrating.

Once herself a JFS client settling in West Hartford, Lucy now works at the Mandell JCC and JFS connecting with Russian-speaking survivors of the Holocaust and others in need of support.

Lucy and three current JFS clients shared their stories one day over tea. Each talked about their experiences putting down strong roots for their families here in America after living through the Holocaust and persecution as Jews. Larisa, a medical doctor. Bronya, a mathematics professor with a Ph.D. in Calculus. Gennadiy, an engineer. Each denied the ability to emigrate to Israel with their families by the Soviet government, and in some cases punished for even making the request. They or their family members were fired from their jobs, denied work, and then, sadly, incarcerated for not working. Their status as ‘refusenik’ lasted years.

Now, Larisa, Bronya, and Gennadiy receive support from JFS including funding from the German Government through the Claims Conference, covering a range of needs from homecare for prolonging independence to a power recliner for mobility assistance. Lucy, along with her colleagues at JFS, work closely to help survivors stay in their homes and thrive in our community.

Care at Home by JFS is committed to touching lives like Emily's, and heartwarming stories like hers are shared and echoed throughout our community. Care at Home by JFS invites the community to be a part of this uplifting journey. One of the best parts of Care at Home by JFS's mission is that all proceeds support JFS's programming and subsidize services for people of all ages. Together, JFS, Care at Home by JFS, and this community make every day brighter for the cherished seniors in our community.

JFS Programs

JFS works holistically, providing a solid foundation of support that helps individuals grow, thrive, and embrace possibility.

- The **Anja Rosenberg Kosher Food Pantry** provides food to anyone in need, whether it is an ongoing need or a one-time crisis. In a grocery store-style setting, we offer fresh produce, eggs, pantry staples, spices, pet food, diapers, paper goods, and also provide **Nutritional Counseling** with a volunteer nutrition consultant.
- **Psychiatric and Counseling Services** with caring, licensed clinicians for children, adolescents, adults, families, and older adults.
- Community support for **Youth Mental Health** addresses youth mental health right here in our community, providing tools, support, and knowledge to help young people thrive.
- The **Holocaust Survivors Program** provides emergency assistance for low-income survivors, and works closely with clients to make sure they have all they need to live life as fully as possible.
- Support for **Russian-Speaking Older Adult** refugees from the former Soviet Union, providing translation, food access, access to benefits, help navigating medical bills, and much more.
- **Technology Supports for Older Adults** including **Uniper**, isolation-reducing TV-based technology; and **Memory Lane TV**, a scientifically researched support for older adults with memory loss.
- **The Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Case Management Program** aids survivors of crime as they navigate the court system, helps them find the resources they need, and promotes healing in the aftermath of crime.
- **The Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF, formerly Welfare to Work) Case Management Program** helps TANF recipients as they develop life goals, increase their income, and avoid eviction or utility shut-off notices.
- **Care at Home by JFS** provides in-home support for older adults, helping them age in place with a team of caregivers who help with activities of daily living. Care at Home by JFS operates as a dynamic social enterprise. The income from these services both sustain the program, and also fuel the provision of free and subsidized services for the broader community.
- **Comprehensive Community Supports** offers holistic case management that helps people access essential support and tools that reduce barriers to financial independence.
- The **Money Coach** helps people take charge of their finances and their lives with expert help from a volunteer CERTIFIED FINANCIAL PLANNER™.
- JFS works with partners to support **Refugees**, helping newcomers who have endured hardship to meet basic needs and acclimate to life in our community.

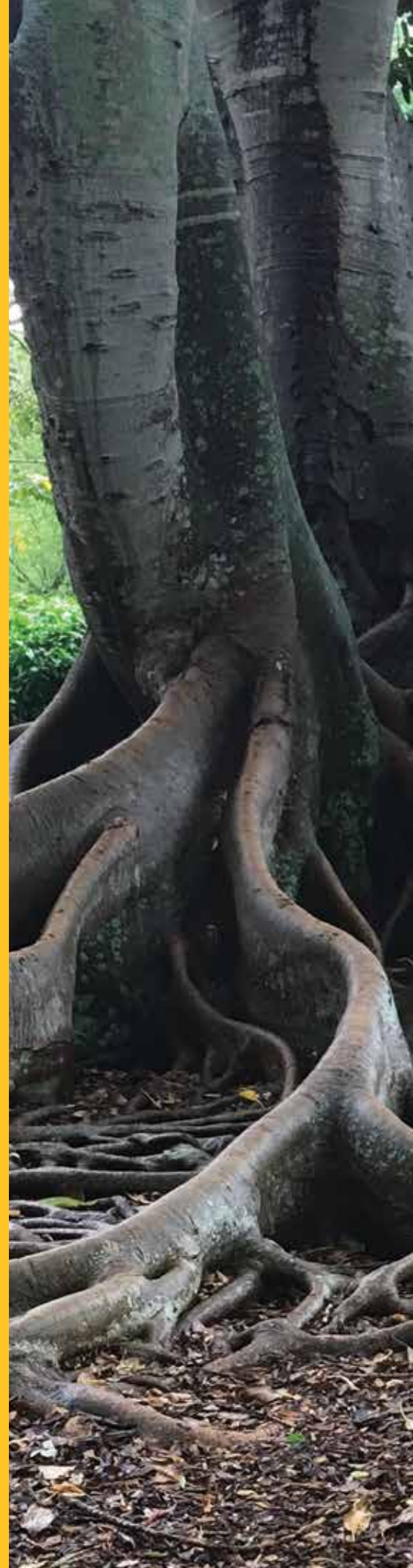
