IFS strengthens, encourages, and supports people from all walks of life, through all of life's changes. From counseling to psychiatric care, across the entire lifespan, JFS helps individuals, couples, and families find their best way forward.

Veronica* has been a JFS counseling client for three years. When she came to JFS, she had just left a bad marriage with her two young children and moved in with her boyfriend.

It seemed like the right thing to do. Veronica struggled with childhood trauma and attention deficit hyperactivity disorder; she never earned her high school diploma. Employed with a low-paying job, she never thought she could make it on her own.

Her boyfriend was abusive and controlling. He tried to interfere with her co-parenting. Soon, Veronica felt she had only two options: satisfy her family by returning to the marriage or satisfy the boyfriend by marrying him. She felt alone and unworthy of more.

JFS helped Veronica see that she had other choices. Her therapist connected her to the Anja Rosenberg Kosher Food Pantry and the JFS back-to-school backpack drive. Veronica worked with the JFS Money Coach to pay down her credit card debt. And slowly, she began to believe she could support her children by herself.

Veronica's JFS therapist helped her sign up for Care for Kids, an early child-care supplement for low-income, working parents. She wrote a reference letter to a landlord so Veronica could rent her own place. And she connected Veronica to Deeds for Needs, which helped furnish the apartment.

Meanwhile, Veronica did the hard part: She built resilience through therapy, started medications for depression and ADHD, and kept on top of her finances.

Today, Veronica lives on her own. She successfully co-parents her children and is moving forward with her divorce. She has even started community college - and she's excited about the future.

With help from JFS, Veronica was able to envision all the possibilities. And that makes all the difference.

Comprehensive Community Supports Key resources for stability

The JFS Comprehensive Community Supports program helps community members build financial confidence and stability, assisting them as they set financial goals and connecting them with resources and skills to achieve their goals.

When Joe* came to JFS, he had been looking for full-time work for a couple of months. He was barely scraping by and then his car broke down – which made it hard to get to interviews. On top of that, he needed to leave a stressful housing situation.

A JFS client support specialist set Joe up with access to the Anja Rosenberg Kosher Food Pantry, and since his car wouldn't run, she arranged delivery. She also connected him to mental health support.

The client support specialist helped Joe obtain a new part for his car, and while Joe's friend was installing it, she provided a ride-share gift card so he could get to job interviews. She also found resources to help cover Joe's back taxes so his car wouldn't be impounded.

In addition, the client support specialist set Joe up with employment seminars to strengthen his resume and job-seeking skills.

The team effort paid off: Joe was offered a full-time position at a decent living wage. When he called JFS for help filling out his W4 form, the client support specialist introduced him to the JFS Money Coach. And when Joe could afford to move, JFS provided a character reference to his new landlord.

Joe told JFS, "I used to be so scared to look at my finances. Now I feel confident. I'm very grateful."













Anja Rosenberg Kosher Food Pantry *Nourishing our neighbors*

The Anja Rosenberg Kosher Food Pantry at JFS provides food to anyone in need – whether it's a one-time crisis or an ongoing challenge. Clients go home with items such as fresh produce, eggs, canned goods and spices, paper goods and diapers, and even pet food.

Food is so much more than a basic human need. It's an expression of culture and identity, a comfort, a way to mark life's milestones. It's a chance to know you are not alone.

Clients seek out the Anja Rosenberg Kosher Food Pantry at JFS for many reasons. We are the only kosher food pantry in central Connecticut, renowned for our quality. We also offer halal food, and we even offer nutrition counseling.

This year, we served 45 percent more clients than last year. Adults over age 60 make up 40 percent of our clients; many are Holocaust survivors. Children under age 18 form another 23 percent. From Old World borscht to birthday cake mix to on-the-go snacks, we offer something for everyone.

As the cost of food, housing, insurance, and utilities has continued to rise, the Anja Rosenberg Kosher Food Pantry at JFS has become an even more vital part of Greater Hartford's safety net.

Holocaust Survivors Program

Emergency assistance and a trusted advocate

Greater Hartford is home to a diverse tapestry of people from all over the world – it's part of what makes our community so vibrant.

But unbeknownst to many, one group carries a special burden. They are Holocaust survivors. Most live near or below the poverty line. Many are from the former Soviet Union. English is typically their second or third language, and they have borne unimaginable hardship with quiet dignity.


As a result of pandemic-related negotiations with the Conference on Jewish Material Claims Against Germany (the organization that provides reparations for this population), many Russian-speaking survivors only recently became eligible for additional support – including emergency assistance for rent, utility bills, dental bills, or in-home care.

JFS Holocaust Survivors Program Case Manager Seva Azimov works exclusively with Russian-speaking clients, making sure they can access the compensation they deserve. Two years ago, when the program began, she was inundated with calls seeking help of all kinds.

"Most of my clients use more than one JFS program, and almost all of them use the Anja Rosenberg Kosher Food Pantry," Azimov says. "I provide translation, outreach, access to government benefits, and other services that help improve the safety and quality of their lives."

More than just connecting them to resources, Azimov earns their trust.

"For a lot of my clients, I am the close person who can advocate for them. Many are lonely. I spend as much time with each client as they need. Our goal is to support this community of individuals who have experienced so much hardship and give them the chance to thrive and age with dignity."





Care at Home by JFS Handling life's transitions with grace

Aging is not for the faint of heart. It requires courage, honesty, and the willingness to accept help. And it often requires more support than today's families can provide.

That's where Care at Home by JFS comes in: We provide hourly and 24/7 live-in care, personal care assistance, friendly companionship, and more to help local seniors age safely in place, as independently as possible.

About 75 percent of Care at Home by JFS clients are Jewish, and many utilize home delivery of nutritious, kosher meals. Regardless of religious or other identity, our clients and their families enjoy our caregivers' personal attention, respect, and kindness.

JFS Programs & Individuals Served

Everyone deserves the tools for a stable and healthy life. JFS provides a variety of basic needs, tools, and supports for people from all walks of life – across the entire lifespan.

The **ANJA ROSENBERG KOSHER FOOD PANTRY** provides food to anyone in need, whether it is a one-time crisis or an ongoing need. Clients select their own fresh produce, eggs, pantry staples, and spices – as well as paper goods, diapers, and pet food. They can also meet with a volunteer nutrition counselor.

MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES include counseling with licensed clinicians for individuals, couples, families, children, adolescents, adults, and seniors as well as psychiatric care for all ages.

YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAMS such as Youth Mental Health First Aid provide information, tools, and support to help young people in our community thrive.

HOLOCAUST SURVIVORS PROGRAM provides emergency assistance to low-income survivors and helps to ensure they have what they need for a stable and healthy life.

RUSSIAN-SPEAKING OLDER ADULTS – including many refugees and Holocaust survivors – receive assistance with language translation, access to benefits and nutritious food, and help navigating social services and medical bills.

TECHNOLOGY SUPPORTS FOR OLDER ADULTS include Uniper, a TV-based technology that reduces isolation, and Memory Lane TV, which is scientifically proven to assist older adults with memory loss.

VICTIMS OF CRIME ACT (VOCA) CASE MANAGEMENT helps survivors of crime navigate the court system, find the resources they need, and begin healing.

TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY FAMILIES (TANF, formerly Welfare to Work) **CASE MANAGEMENT** helps clients develop life goals, build income, and avoid eviction and utility shut-offs.

CARE AT HOME BY JFS provides hourly and round-the-clock live-in care, personal care assistance, companionship, and kosher meal delivery to help local seniors age safely in place, as independently as possible. Care at Home covers its own operating costs and supports a variety of free and subsidized JFS services.

COMPREHENSIVE COMMUNITY SUPPORTS help our neighbors achieve greater financial independence and security through case management, financial education, and more.

THE JFS MONEY COACH is a volunteer CERTIFIED FINANCIAL PLANNER™ who provides expert, one-on-one advice to help clients pay down debt and save for the future.
